

- Be able to devise a 'drilling plan' i.e. identify strata to be drilled through and dowse the depth of each stratum

Ideally, students should have visited a site, during drilling, prior to this course.

The tutor for these two water courses is Aaron Bray, Chairman of the BSD Water and Site Dowsing Group, a member of the BSD Professional Register for water dowsing and a BSD Registered Tutor. Aaron travels the country successfully dowsing to locate sites for new water supplies and sinking boreholes for water abstraction.

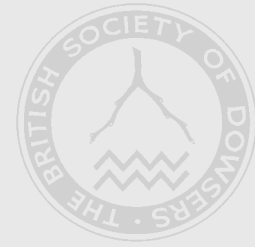

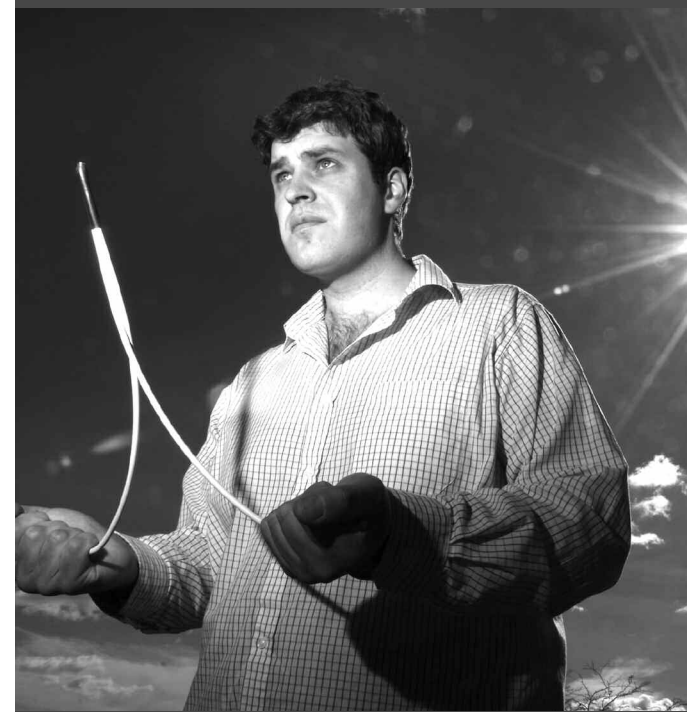

Water & Site Dowsing Courses

Ask anyone if they have heard about dowsing and they will normally respond that it is about searching for water.

Ask any BSD member what sort of dowsing they enjoy and the answers will usually include the subjects of health, earth mysteries, archaeology and just occasionally water!

The fact is that the demand for water dowzers is growing. Water is becoming a scarce resource – and not just in less well developed countries.



How Can I Develop My Skills?

If you are looking at developing your dowsing skills to a professional level, then water & site dowsing is a subject we would urge you to consider. In the UK we are already very short of skilled water & site dowzers – it is the next big growth area.

As a first step you should consider our General & Practical Dowsing Course. The details are set out below, but if you have completed the BSD Foundation Course or equivalent, this course will enable you to become far more confident about searching for concealed site features. Drains, cables, water mains – all these and more are things all dowzers should be able to find.

Searching for Water

If you are interested in the search for water, then the introductory course is the place to start. As with all our more advanced courses you will need to have attended a BSD Foundation Course or equivalent. This course will really focus on dowsing for water as a single subject and you will be learning from a dowser who actually makes a living from it!

Once you have mastered this course content you can move on to a more advanced course which includes all you need to know to become a professional. From there you effectively enter into a one to one apprenticeship with the same water dowser. This is a terrific opportunity for anyone really keen to acquire this much needed skill.

General and Practical Dowsing
